Instructions for Students

If you would like your poster to be judged in our student poster competition, we suggest you tailor your poster and presentation to the rubrics our judges will be using to evaluate your work (see below).

The first round of judging will take place **virtually** (see 1st round rubric) and will only evaluate the poster itself. The SESE Research Review committee will then create an awards shortlist for each group (Atmospheric Sciences Grads, ESEC Grads, GGIS Grads, All Undergrads).

The presenters of posters on the awards shortlist will be notified prior to the Research Review and asked to present their work in front of the judges as part of the second round of judging (see 2nd round rubric) which will take place from 2:00 - 3:00pm on Friday, Feb 9. However, all presenters are encouraged to be at their posters during Research Review to discuss their work with attendees, even if they are not being judged. Poster presentations are from 2:00 - 3:20, with judging ending at 3:00.
